

## **Before the First Word: Entering Sacred Space**

A Welcome for All: Good morning, and welcome to worship at South Congregational Church in East Hartford. We are an Open and Affirming congregation of the United Church of Christ, celebrating God's love for all people: of every age, race, gender identity, sexual orientation, ability, need, education level, and income. We welcome diverse beliefs, but not those rooted in hate or exclusion. This is a place for the spiritually curious, not the certain; for those who seek compassion over control. We honor each person's story and make space for questions, growth, and the mystery of God's love made known in Jesus. No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you belong here!

Meditation: God's presence breaks into our ordinary days, often in ways we least expect. A bush burning, yet not consumed, turned Moses' life upside down. Where are the "burning bushes" in our own stories? Today we listen for God's call in the unfolding chapters of our lives. In the places we least expect, God is writing holy words across our lives, calling us to notice, to listen, and to follow.

## Children in Worship

We are glad to have children in worship. A **Children's Shelf** is located in the Narthex (just outside the sanctuary) and is stocked with quiet activities and toys to help children engage during the service. Children are invited to visit the shelf on their way into the sanctuary, bring items to their pew, and return them after the service. These materials are intended to support children's participation in worship and are for use in the sanctuary.

## A Note About Sunday School

South Church has transitioned from a traditional Sunday School model, where children are offered instruction outside of the sanctuary, to an inclusive family centered service for all. A Children's Shelf in the narthex has quiet activities available for younger children, while the worship bulletin offers engaging opportunities for older children and the young at heart. This decision has been made prayerfully and with intentionality, with the focus on creating a Sunday worship experience that promotes fellowship, inclusivity and celebrates all of God's beloved people.
