Our Ministry, Our Call

INSTALLATION AND CALL

What's all this talk about an "Installation"?

"In the United Church of Christ, a *Service of Installation* is a special kind of worship service that celebrates a new partnership between a pastor and a congregation. It's how we formally recognize that the **Holy Spirit** has called *this pastor* to *this church* for *this time*. It's a day when the **congregation**, the **wider church**, and the **new pastor** all affirm their shared ministry together." - *from the United Church of Christ Book of Worship*

This special service will take place on **Sunday, November 23 at 3:00 p.m.**

In conversations with friends and members of the church, I've heard people describe it as "Kevin's Installation." That always makes me smile, because yes, I am the new pastor, but the celebration isn't about me. **It's about us.**

As the description above reminds us, it's a day when the congregation, the wider church, and the new pastor all affirm their shared ministry together. For me, it's one of the most beautiful rituals in our denomination. It says: **You belong here. We belong to one another. And together, we belong to God.**

South Church spent many months in prayerful discernment, forming a Transition Team, conducting a Search, meeting candidates, and listening deeply for God's leading. I was doing the same on my end, discerning where God might be calling me next. By grace, those paths met right here in East Hartford.

That's what we'll celebrate at the Installation, not a single person's journey, **but the faithful, hopeful work of a whole congregation listening to the Spirit.** That's also why you'll see members of both the Transition and Search Committees participating in the service, along with leaders from our Association and Conference. It will be a celebration of partnership and call, of the Holy Spirit's work among us.

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GRATITUDE GROWS

That same spirit of faith and collaboration is at the heart of our Stewardship Campaign, which officially began with a letter sent in the mail last week and with worship this past Sunday. The theme, which I introduced in that letter and preached about on Sunday, Gratitude Grows, reminds us that **every act of generosity, large or small, plants a seed that helps this community grow stronger.**

Last Sunday, Ceal shared a heartfelt reflection on what this church means to her and why she gives. In the weeks ahead, others will share their own stories, too. I love these moments because they show how each of us experiences God's generosity in our own way.

Stewardship, at its best, is not about pressure or numbers. It's about participation, about each person considering what they can joyfully give to support the ministry we share. Every circumstance is different, and the decision about how generous to be is ultimately between you and God. But when we all listen, pray, and respond as we are able, the combined result is powerful.

GROWING TOGETHER

I often think of stewardship as a team sport. Every member of the team has a role to play, and *everyone* contributes, some through larger gifts, others through smaller ones, all joined with time, energy, and prayer. **Together, our shared giving becomes more than any of us could do alone.**

That's what makes this such an exciting season for South Church. As we celebrate our Installation and embark on this year's stewardship journey, we're reminded that ministry is a shared calling. We are co-workers in God's Garden, planting seeds of hope, care, and love right here in East Hartford.

I can't wait to celebrate with you on **November 16th and 23rd**, and to see how gratitude continues to grow among us in the weeks and years ahead.

While on a walk recently at the West Hartford reservoir, I found myself positioned squarely in the middle of a high school girls cross country meet. While I was impressed by the grace and precision exhibited by these young athletes, what struck me the most were the spectators that supported them as they exited the wooded trails and stepped onto the pavement paths. This collection of parents, coaches, pacers, and friends offered words of encouragement, comfort, reassurance, guidance, and praise. No matter the school, rank or position of the runner, the commentary remained the same. "You've got this! Stay with the group! No need to run ahead. You are stronger together! Pace yourself. Watch for the downward curve of that next turn. Look for your teammates. There is gravel ahead. Just keep going!"

As I navigated the course, unintentionally, and did my best to stay out of the way of the runners, a vision for South Church began to emerge. With the introduction of the **Board for Community Engagement** comes the blessing of continuing to share the journey. While we may not be running a cross-country race, I believe the analogy remains relevant to the work we are called to do. We're combining the boards of Christian Education and Growth because there's already significant overlap in both the people involved and the work being done. This change helps to align our mission and keeps all our board volunteers engaged in ministries that enable us to fortify our efforts. We will champion the work of love, both inside and outside of the church walls. We will celebrate our friends and neighbors, remind one another to keep a "steady pace," support those struggling alongside us, and wait patiently for those that have not even gotten off the trail. We will proceed with enthusiasm and kindness, compassion and grace, thoughtfulness, and quiet wisdom, and be open to the ways God continues to move us forward in this sacred community of faith. Look for your teammates, my friends, and just keep going!

Jared Box Project Suggested Toy List

Infant (0 to 12 months)

Softcover books, cardboard books, rattles, bibs, stacking blocks, farm animal sets, clip-on toys for strollers or cribs, crib mirrors, bath toys, stuffed animals, balls, busy boxes, light-up toys, musical toys, Oball toys. Lamaze®, Bright Starts®, and Sassy® brand toys are great.

Other toys that are labeled as suggested for infants.

Be aware of choking hazards.

Toddler (1 to 3)

Softcover books, cardboard books, stacking blocks, farm animal sets, small toys that clip on strollers, bath toys, stuffed animals, balls, busy boxes, musical toys, colorful pillowcases, fun socks, chunky crayons, coloring books, flashcards, plastic cars, puppets, soft dolls.

Other toys that are labeled as suggested for children under 3.

Be aware of choking hazards.

Preschool (3 to 5)

Crayons, coloring books, grab-n-go activity kits, reading books, stickers, sticker workbooks, activity books, matchbox cars, NERF or rubber balls, stuffed animals, flashcards, fun socks, small action figures, small dolls, travel size games, Silly Putty, simple puzzles, card games (Go Fish, Old Maid, Memory), colorful pillowcases, dress up items, farm animal sets, dinosaurs.

Other toys that are labeled as suggested for Preschoolers.

Elementary (5 to 8)

Crayons, markers, colored pencils, pens, coloring books, word searches, activity books, reading books, joke books, matchbox cars, NERF balls, stuffed animals, stickers, Silly Putty, LEGO kits, craft kits, Slinky, travel games (Sorry, Connect 4), hand lotion, colorful pillowcases, reusable water bottle, fun socks, action figures, puzzles, deck of cards, UNO card game.

Other toys that are labeled as suggested for school-aged children.

Tweens & Teens (8 and up)

Crayons, markers, colored pencils, pens, coloring books, word searches, doodle pads, writing journals, Silly Putty, stuffed animals, card games, LEGO kits, puzzles, brain games, books, magazines, Chapstick®, hand lotion, fun socks, colorful pillowcases, jewelry making kits, craft kits, paint sets, reusable water bottle.

Other items that are labeled as suggested for teens.

All items must be new. No food items. No tiny items due to choking hazards.

No snow globes or glass items that can break. No pencil sharpeners.

No bubbles. No holiday items.

Keep in mind, toys need to fit into a plastic shoe box.
