

A Letter from Paul . . .

Greetings to the church in East Hartford and grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord Jesus.

On April 1st (no fooling) I will begin a three month term as your bridge minister and so I would like to give you some ways that our time will be most fruitful for both you and me. Though I retired two years ago determining that I was "done" with ministry, I am fully aware of how my best plans today can take a hard right turn tomorrow and I'm off in on a different track. We have agreed to three months subject to extension depending upon the needs of the church and my own path. I do look forward to working with your great staff of Jeff, Lisa and Krista. I have met with them all and am excited to do ministry with them and the membership.

Aware that life forces and rhythms of each congregation are unique I propose starting with the following basics. Once I have been able to sense the flow hours may be subject to change so that our needs are better served. But for now...

- Do I call you "Pastor Paul", "Rev. Paul", "Rev. Goodman", "Paul" or something else? The answer is Yes. Congregational customs vary and I am fine with whatever you like. (I am fine with "Paul" as I have been that for 71+ years and the others for only 35!)

- **Office hours**: Regular in person hours Monday and Thursday from 10-2:30
- **Other hours** can be arranged and I also am available for Zoom calls/consults
- When texting/emailing me there are a few things I ask. First that you always start with whatever name you have chosen for me as a start. I have in the past gotten communications which were NOT intended for me but because they didn't start with a salutation I didn't understand that until I had been further into it often reading confidential information not intended for my eyes! If it doesn't say "Paul" then I don't read it. Second, close with your name. I don't automatically know who (860) 555-0030 or sewinggal@msn.com is and don't like having to say "Who is this?" as a response if I respond to an unknown author at all. So "Dear Paul, -- blah, blah, blah --Thanks Betty" is best way to get a response.
- TITDOE short for "Too involved to discuss on email" -- is occasionally a response to complex issues that cannot be adequately handled via email or text. When something is TITDOE it means let's talk in person, via Zoom or phone.
- ✤ Name tags are really helpful in my learning names. I am pretty good at that and with the aid of name tags actually great! So if you have name tags please wear them and if not, be sure to say your name when we meet. For those who watch worship streamed to them please text/email/call to say you participated via the stream so that I know you were part of the worship.
- ✤ About humor. I take my faith and role as a pastor very seriously, but that doesn't mean that they and I must be somber. Laughter and joy are biblical concepts – you may have heard about the "joy of the Lord." So please don't misinterpret my love of humor and laughter as indicative of my lack of seriousness in worship, church, ministry or faith.
- Experience has taught me that successful ministry is a give and take, push and pull, ebb and flow between congregation, staff and pastor. Fruitful ministry in the name of Jesus Christ is best accomplished and feedback and critique is best offered and received when all parties remain: *patient, flexible and kind*. So please keep those in mind when dealing with me, staff and one another. It's the best way to be like Jesus!

We are called to an active faith, not a passive one. As such, our thoughts and prayers are not sufficient action on their own.
