## Pastor's Message

Dear South Church Family,

There's something sacred about summer. The rhythm slows just enough for us to breathe a little deeper, linger a little longer, and notice beauty that might pass us by in other seasons. Whether you're heading to the beach, staying close to home, traveling across the country, or simply enjoying your own backyard, I hope you're finding pockets of peace and wonder along the way.

This summer, the Board of Christian Education and Faith Enrichment is offering two creative and meaningful ways to help us stay spiritually connected while we're out in the world.

The first is a practice called **Godspotting**. Think of it as a way to slow down and notice where God shows up in your life. Maybe it's in the quiet hush of the woods, the crash of waves at the beach, the smile of a stranger, or the peace that comes with a morning cup of coffee. I arrived at 8 a.m. thinking I'd be early to help, only to discover many of you had already been working for hours. The energy was electric. I had to leave around noon and I did so with a full heart, grateful to be part of a community that lives out its faith so generously.


## Pastor's Message...
